The Headmasters of all the Government and Government Aided Middle Schools and High schools:

Sub.: Assessment of Students' Performance in ECE Activities

Sir/Madam,

As you are aware, ECE programme is being implemented in Classes V to VIII from the current academic year (2022-23). We have received request from teachers to provide them the guidelines for assessment of performance of students in ECE activities. Since ECE content are integrated into the Science and Social Science textbooks and we are at the near end of the academic year, assessment of students' performance in these components might have been taken care of by the teachers/schools as part of their regular assessment.

Therefore, only for this **academic year** (2022-23), it has been decided to assign group or individual project (the teacher concerned to decide whether to assign group or individual project) to the students, **one each** in "Sanitation and Waste Management" and "Traffic Awareness and Road Safety".

Two components of a project shall be considered for assessment.

1. Written Project report
2. Oral Presentation of the project report.

Assessment in each component shall be done separately on a 5- points grading scale as follows.

Description of Performance	Grade	Grade Point
Very Good	A	5
Good	B	4
Average	C	3
Poor	D	2
Very Poor	E	1

A student will obtain one Grade for each component. The obtained Grades in both the components (both Grades) shall be combined following the procedures described below.

Both the Grade Points in a project shall be added and then divided by 2. The obtained value called Grade Point Average (GPA) up to one decimal shall be considered and the same shall be converted in to a Grade.

Example:

Suppose the written project report of a particular student is judged as 'Good' and accordingly Grade 'A' is awarded. The performance of the same student is 'Average' in his/her oral presentation of the report and hence he/she is awarded Grade C.

The corresponding Grade point for Grade A is 5 and that of Grade C is 3. By adding 5 and 3 we get 8 and dividing 8 by 2 we get GPA 4. Following the Grading Table, the corresponding Grade for GPA 4 is Grade 'B'. Hence the final Grade of the student in a particular project is 'B' Grade.

Following the same procedures, each student shall be awarded a Grade in the other project.

The Obtained Grades of the Students in both the projects shall be shown on the Mark sheet/ Grade Sheet by inserting a separate Row/Column.

The detail guidelines for assessment of performance in ECE activities from the next academic year (2023-24) shall be issued in due course of time.
