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CIRCULAR

Sub: Academic Calendar and Scheme of Assessment from Grades 1 to 8 for the Academic Year 2024-25

As you are aware, all schools defined under Section 2 (n) of RTE Act 2009 and schools recognised by Directorate of Education, Goa are required to follow the Curriculum and Evaluation Procedures prescribed by SCERT, Goa.

Academic Calendar and the Scheme of Assessment in different subjects to be followed in the academic year 2024-25 in different subjects in Grades 1 to 8 is attached herewith. Schools have to ensure that the Academic Calendar and Assessment Scheme are implemented in letter and spirit. Further, the below mentioned points must be considered in following/implementing the Scheme of Assessment.

- 1. From Grade 3 onwards, the entire course content covered during a Semester has to be considered for assessment at the Semester-End assessment.
- 2. Ensure that assessment is as continuous and comprehensive as possible.
- 3. The purpose of all assessment is to motivate each learner to improve his/her performance to the best of his/her capability.
- 4. In all Language Subjects, the priority is to develop all four basic language skills (Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing) in the learners. Therefore, teachers have to keep this point in mind while assessing performance of learners in languages.
- 5. In Grades 6, 7 & 8, in each Semester and in every subject each learner shall undertake one project/assignment/field work/practical as the case may be for

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which 10 marks (5 marks for written report and 5 marks for oral) are allocated out of 60 marks allotted for Semester-end assessment. Teachers shall assign the project/assignment/field work/practical to learners in the Month of August (in the case of Semester – I) and in January (in the case of Semester – II) and the learners have to complete the same before commencement of Semester-End Assessment.

- In every assessment, performance of students shall be assessed using the numerical marking system as specified subject-wise and for each Grade (Class).
- 7. The numerical marks in each assessment shall be converted in to Letter Grade by following the grading scale given below.

Note: The detail procedure for conversion of marks to Letter Grades in each assessment and in each Grade/Class is attached as Annexure – I for ready reference.

8. In final certification i.e. at the end of each semester/academic year, the following Grading Scale shall be followed.

9. At the end of each Grade (year-end), the performance of students in both the Semesters shall be combined by following procedures explained below.

Example -1: Suppose in 'Mathematics' a student obtained 'A' grade in Semester - I and Grade 'C' in Semester - II. His/her Grade Points (GP) are 5 and 4 respectively. The average GP is 5+3 ÷ 2 = 4. Hence, the obtained Grade by the student is 'B'. Example – 2: Suppose in 'Mathematics' a student obtained 'C' grade in Semester - I and Grade 'D' in Semester - II. His/her Grade Points (GP) are 3 and 2 respectively. The average GP is $3+2 \div 2 = 2.5$. Hence, the obtained Grade by the student is 'C'.

10. Procedures for assessment of performance in Co-Scholastic areas remain unchanged but in certification the Grading Scale given above shall be followed

Steps to be followed for Converting Marks into Letter Grades in each Assessment.

- i. Convert the marks into percentage. **Example**: Suppose a learner of Grade 6 have obtained 13 marks out of 20 in Assessment 1 in Science. Then his/her percentage of marks in Science is 13 ÷ 20X100 = 65%.
- ii. Determine the corresponding Grade of the said percentage of marks using the information given in Table 3 below.

Since in above example obtained score is 65%, the Letter Grade obtained by the learner is Grade "B"

- iii. Enter 'B' in the grade sheet of the said learner for Assessment 1.
- iv. Follow the same procedures in all the subjects of each learner and complete the Grade Sheet.

4. Steps to be followed for awarding Grades in each Semester (Semester Total)

i. Add the marks obtained by a learner in all the Assessments in a given Semester in a given Subject and obtain the Semester total Marks for each subject. (Note: Schools have to maintain register containing marks obtained by learners in each assessment in all the subjects). Example: Suppose a learner of Grade/Class - 4 in Semester – 1 obtained mark as follows in Konkani.

	Marks Allotted	Marks Obtained
Assessment – 1	20	12
Assessment – 2	20	11
Assessment – 3	20	10
Assessment – 4	40	26

- ii. Convert the obtained Semester total marks in to percentage. In the above example, if we convert the marks into %, we get **59%** (59 ÷ 100 X 100).
- iii. Determine the corresponding Grade of the said percentage of marks using the information in Table 3 above. In the given example, the corresponding Letter Grade for 59% marks is 'C'.
- iv. Enter grade 'C' in the Grade Sheet of the said learner against Konkani as overall Semester 1 performance.
