ANNEXURE I

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Grades 1 & 2 will have National Initiative for Proficiency in Reading with Understanding and Numeracy (NIPUN) based Assessment as given below:
 - 1) Base line Assessment in July 2025
 - 2) Mid line Assessment at the end of Semester I
 - 3) End line Assessment at the end of Semester II
- 2. The Grades 3 to 8 will have semester pattern comprising of two components: Internal Component and External component during the year 2025-2026.
- 3. The internal component (for grades 4, 5, 7 & 8) will have to be conducted exclusively by the schools as per the guidelines given in the subject wise Scheme of Assessment.
- 4. As NEP-2020 is being implemented for grade 3 and grade 6, the internal assessment for these grades will be entirely using assessment rubrics based on content-based activities. There will be no written formative assessment for grades 3 and 6.
- 5. The Curricular Goals' aligned activities that are required to be conducted by the teachers, listed in the textbooks, are suggestive. Teachers are free to develop their own similar activities.
- 6. There will be a common Semester-End Examination for all classes from Grades 3 to 8. GSCERT will set and distribute common question papers to all schools for semester end examination, along with a standardized examination schedule, which must be strictly followed by all institutions. However, the evaluation of the answer papers and result preparation will be carried out by the respective schools.
- 7. The Semester end question paper for grades 3 & 6 will be only competency-based. However, for other grades it will be not entirely competency-based.
- 8. The entire content covered during a particular semester will be considered for the semester end examination.
- 9. The pattern of the Semester-End Examination question paper along with model question paper will be sent to schools subsequently.
- 10. The standard format for preparing the progress card of all grades (grade 3 to 8) will be shared with the schools separately.
- 11. The sports merit marks (if applicable) to any of the students will be given as per the guidelines of Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education (GBSHSE), Alto- Porvorim.
- 12. The use of Dictionaries and supplementary reading should be encouraged in all Grades across all subjects.
